BP1

(Broken Pekoe 1)

"Broken Pekoe 1," which is a grade of black tea, specifically referring to the largest particle size of broken tea leaves produced through the CTC (Cut, Tear, Curl) method, resulting in a slightly lighter body with still noticeable flavor characteristics; it's considered a mid-range quality tea often sourced from Kenya and other East African regions

- Black, neat and well rolled leaf.
- The grade has very strong liquor and flavour.
- Best with or without milk.
- Clean Black leaf
- Clean liquors with brightness and strength.

- Best without Milk.

PF1

(Pekoe Fannings 1)

Pekoe Fanning 1(PF1)-Forms the bulk of the production about 58-60% and made up of black grainy particles slightly smaller than the BP1.

- Clean and black leaf, little mixed, leafy.
- Bright liquors with flavour and aroma.
- Best with milk.
- Jet black composed leaf
- Bright and strong liquor

- Best with or without milk.

PD

(Pekoe Dust)

Pekoe Dust (PD)-Forms 10-12% of the production, often black and finer than the PFI and has thick liquors and aroma.

Pekoe Fanning 1(PFI) - Forms the bulk of the production about 58-60% and made up of black grainy particles slightly smaller than the BPI.

BP

(Broken Pekoe)

Broken Pekoe 1(BP1)-Forms about 12-14% of the total production and has the largest size particles. Liquors are light in colour but have an encouraging flavouring characteristic.

- Bold, black and clean leaf
- Bright liquors with aroma

- Best without milk.

PF'S

(Pekoe Fannings)

Mixed leaf with black tea which has some fibre.

Pekoe Fanning (PFs)-Forms the bulk of the production about 58-60% and made up of black grainy particles slightly smaller than the BP1.

- Strong cups with coarseness
- Used for tea bags
- Can be blended with Pf1, fngs in different ratio.

- Consumed with or without milk

FNGS

(Fannings)

FNGS. Fanning's broken leaves, slightly larger than dust.

- Composed of tiny leafy fragments, with trace of black tea, making it coarse in texture.
- Strong cups with flavour
- Can be used for Tea bag or Loose tea.

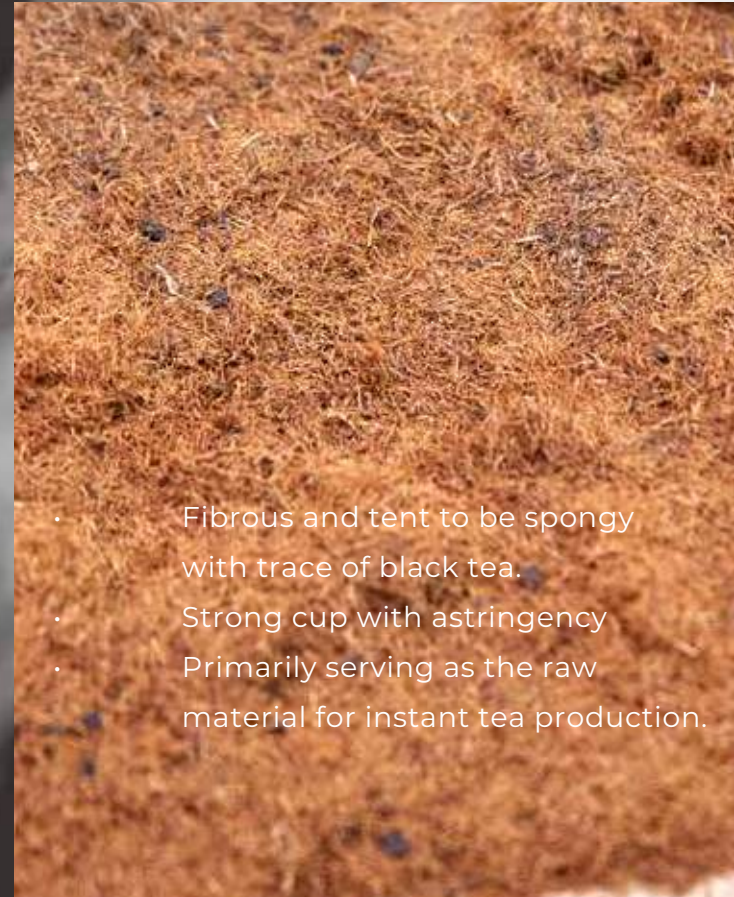
- Best without Milk, (Slice of Lemon makes it sweeter)

BMFS

(Broken Mixed Fannings)

BMF stands for Broken Mixed Fannings, a grade of tea that's mainly made of fibrous matter with a small amount of black tea. BMF is a key part of the tea industry because it's a cost-effective raw material for instant tea production.

- Fibrous and tend to be spongy with trace of black tea.
- Strong cup with astringency
- Primarily serving as the raw material for instant tea production.

- Consumed without milk.

DUST

Dust tea is the lowest grade of tea, It's made from the smallest remnants of tea leaves created during the sorting and crushing processes. Dust tea is often used in tea bags because of its strong flavor and color.

- Powdery with Course touch, not as black.
- Quick powerful brew, its flavor is intense and bold, perfect for a single brew.
- Often used in tea bags or blended into more affordable teas

- Best without Milk, (Slice of Lemon makes it sweeter

OP1

(Orange Pekoe 1)

- The grade is known for its long wiry and well twisted leaves.
- It has golden reddish liquor which offers an excellent cup with a malty taste (characteristic of high-grown Kenyan teas).
- The exquisite aroma makes it favorite among tea enthusiasts seeking the best Kenyan tea experience.
- For those who appreciate a nuanced, aromatic profile, this is the perfect choice to buy.

- Best without Milk,

OP

(Orange Pekoe)

It is a whole leaf tightly rolled and intact, twisted with wiry appearance with no tips.

- OP has thin and light liquors with complex flavour and delicate aromas



Orange Pekoe doesn't refer to an orange-flavored tea, or even a tea that brews up an orange-y copper color. Instead, Orange Pekoe refers to a particular grade of black tea.



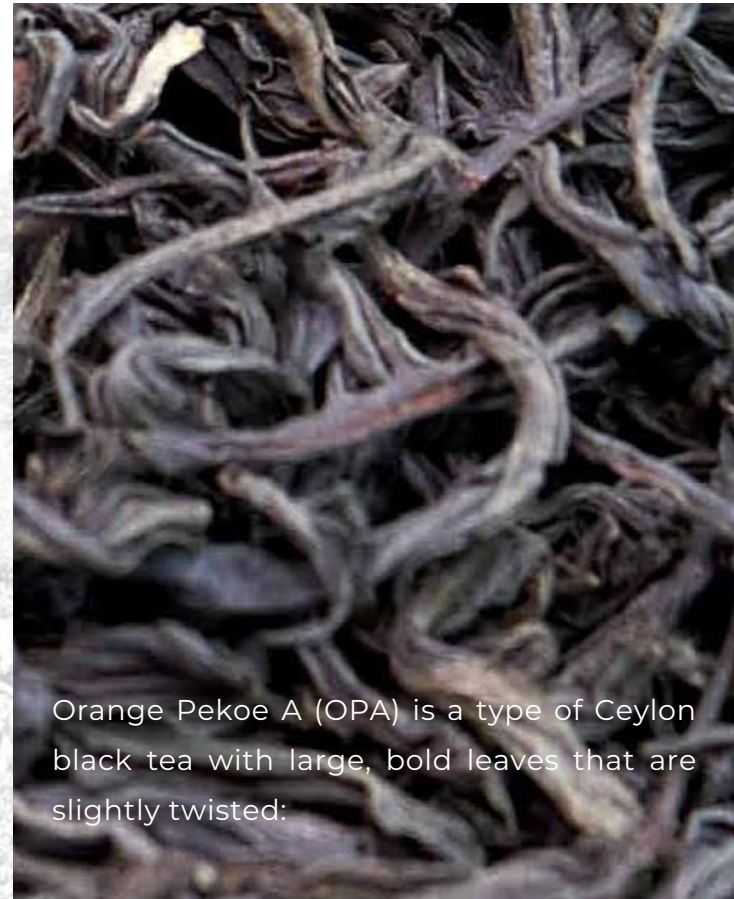
OPA

(Orange Pekoe A)

- Consists of large, bold and slightly twisted leaves which are larger compared to OP and OP1
- Its cup is fairly bright golden reddish liquor with a mild taste.

Orange Pekoe A (OPA) is a type of Ceylon black tea with large, bold leaves that are slightly twisted:

- Consumed without milk.

P/PEK

(Pekoe)

- They bear a resemblance to black peppercorn
- Offers a light golden reddish delicate liquor, making it visually appealing.
- Pekoe is more demanded for its attractive appearance than for its cup quality.

FBOPF

(Flowery Broken Orange Pekoe Fannings)

- FBOPF is characterized by its small, broken leaves, rich in golden tips from the tea buds.
- This grade delivers a light golden reddish brew with a typical aromatic scent,
- FBOPF provides an elegant balance of flavor and aroma. Be sure to sip on a well-rounded cup.
- Best choice for those who prefer a lighter yet aromatic tea.

(FBOPF) is a type of black tea.

FOP

(Flowery Orange Pekoe)

- This is a high-quality grade of orthodox tea with an attractive leaf appearance characterized by long, semi-wiry leaves with visible tips.
- The cup has flavour with floral character, slightly darker liquor that is brisker and bright.


Flowery Orange Pekoe is a classification of black tea based upon the origin of the leaf. Its purely composed of the new flushes.

- Consumed without milk.

FOF

(Flowery Orange Fannings)

- This tea grade consists of smaller leafy particles with some fanning's that are finely broken and smaller in size compared to whole leaf teas.
- Gives a strong, brisk flavour with slightly astringent taste. (a rapid infuse make it release its flavour quickly) though lacking in the subtle notes found in higher grade teas.
- Used more in blending with CTC teas can be used for Tea bags as well.
